

FUNERAL OF MRS J. G. WILKINSON.

The funeral of the late Mrs Wilkinson, wife of our respected fellow-citizen, Mr J. G. Wilkinson, Ivy Bank, Ennis Road, took place from St. Mary's Cathedral at 4 p.m. on Thursday for the family burial place at St. John's Churchyard. The cortege was large and representative of all classes and creeds, and fully testified to the esteem and regard in which the deceased lady was held in the city, and of deep sympathy with her husband and relatives in the sorrow which has unexpectedly come to them. It is a touching coincidence that Thursday, the day of the funeral, would have been the 51st anniversary of the wedding of Mr and Mrs Wilkinson. After the ordinary burial service in the Cathedral, the officiating clergymen being the Rev. Treasurer Abbott and the Rev. R. J. Ross, Succentor, the remains were removed to the hearse in waiting.
