## DEAN OF BRISBANE DIES IN LIMERICK.

The Right Rev. Monsignor William Lee, P.P., V.G., Dean of Brisbane, Australia, a native of Cashel, died at Milford House, Limerick, on Tuesday. While on a holiday in his native land the Dean became ill, and had been a patient in the Home at Milford for some six months. Educated at Rockwell College, and at Mount Melleray, and All Hallows Foreign Mission College, Dublin, he was ordained for the Brisbane Diocese forty years ago. He was a distinguished Churchman, and his record as a builder of churches and schools will long be remembered in the Antipodes. He was a brother of Mr Patrick Lee, Freighduff, Cashel, who died a few weeks ago.

The funeral took place at Cashel to-day after Office and High Mass, the interment being at Boherlahan Churchyard.
