DEATH OF MR. P. GRIFFIN, BALLINACURRA NURSERY.

We regret to record the death of Mr Patrick Griffin, proprietor Ballinacurra Nursery, which took place at his residence last Thursday night at an advanced age. He had been in failing health for the past few years, and has passed away to the deep regret of a wide circle of friends, who found in him an estimable citizen and a kindly and courteous gentleman. In his early life he managed the Nursery for the firm of Messrs J. & G. Boyd. Half a century ago he took the Nursery over, and since then had displayed characteristic enterprise in developing the Nursery as one of the best known in the country. Needless to say, as a florist and horticulturist he was an expert, and when in the prime of life he travelled extensively in foreign countries in connection with his business. For the past fourteen years he was assisted by his nephew, Mr J. P. Griffin, with whom and the other relatives deep sympathy is extended in their bereavement.

The remains were removed to St. Michael's Church last evening.

The funeral took place this morning, after Requiem Mass at 10.30, for Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery. The cortege was large and representative, and wreaths were sent by relatives, the Nursery staff, and other friends.
