HEALTH OF LIMERICK.

For the five weeks ended the 25th May
eight cases of diphtheria, four of acute
primary pneumonia, and four of scarlatina,
were notified, as against six of diphtheria
and two of scarlatina during the previous
five weeks. For the same period one
hundred and nine tuberculosis patients
attended the dispensary, twenty-four were
in hospital, twelve in sanatoria, and seven
died. The number of visits paid to patients'
homes totalled one hundred and twenty-
seven. From the 29th April to the 25th
May 2,023 were treated under the diphtheria
immunisation scheme.

DEATH OF MRS. ELLEN LOCKE.

Ellen Locke, relict of the late Mr Thomas
Locke, formerly of Denmark street. She
