Necessity for Improvements to Line

Ennis, Monday—"If in the near future a wide-gauge line is not substituted for the present narrow gauge on the West Clare Railway, it will mean the death-knell of the county, because there will be absolutely no possible chance of development," declared Mr. Michael Hanrahan, of Doonbeg, at a meeting in Ennis held to prepare data for submission to President de Valera, who is to be asked to support the local agitation for improvements to the railway line.

Mr P. Hogan, T.D., Leas Ceann Comhairle, presided.

There was a lengthy discussion and exchange of views, and a sub-committee was appointed to draft a report on the necessity for widening of the line. This report will be considered by the parent body in due course, and when approved, with or without amendments, will be submitted to President de Valera with a request for his personal intervention in the matter.
