**FATAL STREET ACCIDENT.**

James Callinan, aged six years, Garry-  
owen, was struck by a motor lorry in Clare  
street on Thursday night, and succumbed  
to his injuries some hours later. The child  
was on the roadway, and although the  
driver of the lorry made a commendable  
effort to avoid him he did not succeed. The  
child was taken to Barrington's Hospital,  
where everything possible was done for him,  
but he never rallied.

An inquest was opened by the Deputy  
Coroner (Mr J. S. McNeice, solr.), and a  
jury yesterday

Supt. Downey conducted the inquiry. Mr  
D. G. O'Donovan, solr., for the next-of-kin  
of deceased, and Miss K. Tynan, solr., for  
the driver of the lorry, John Tuohy, Castle-  
connell.

Evidence having been given, the inquest  
was adjourned. Sympathy was expressed  
by Miss Tynan on behalf of the driver of  
the lorry; and the Coroner, Supt. Downey,  
and the jury, with the relatives of the  
deceased.
