Employees' Holidays.

We have received the following:—
 At a conference between the Directors of the Limerick Shoe and Slipper Works, Ltd., and the Limerick Branch Irish Transport and General Workers' Union it was agreed that all workers members of the Irish Transport and General Workers' Union, employed by the Limerick Shoe and Slipper Works, Ltd., shall receive one week's (six consecutive working days) holidays with full wages for 1935 (holidays to be given month of July), and that, without prejudice to Conditions of Employment Bill, 1935, all workers covered by the agreement shall be paid for Christmas Day, 1935, in addition to two holidays—St. Patrick's Day and Easter Monday—already paid for by agreement.
