## BATHING FATALITY AT ADARE.

A very sad bathing fatality occurred in  
the river Maigue, near Adare railway  
station, at a spot known as "Poul," about  
5.30 on Sunday evening, when John  
Considine (21), of Clorane, lost his life.  
Deceased, so far as is known, was a poor  
swimmer, and must have got into difficul-  
ties. He was a very promising young man,  
and deep sympathy is expressed with his  
father and the other members of the family  
in their very sad bereavement.

The circumstances of the tragedy were  
given at the inquest held yesterday at  
Adare by Dr M. R. Cleary, Coroner for  
East Limerick.

Daniel Considine, brother of the deceased,  
said that he decided to go for a bathe, and  
witness accompanied him to the river bank.  
Witness then went away, and did not hear  
of the tragedy until late on Sunday evening.

Michael Manley, a Limerick fisherman,  
said that at about ten minutes to six he  
was passing by the spot where deceased had  
gone to bathe. He noticed clothes on the  
bank, and as there was nobody bathing at  
the time he called his friends' attention to  
the fact. They informed the Gardai, who  
immediately came and began to drag the  
river.

Michael Morrissey, Adare, said he and  
his brother assisted in the dragging opera-  
tions. At 7.45 p.m. they found the body  
lying in about four or five feet of water, and  
it was subsequently removed to the local  
courthouse.

A verdict that death was due to asphyxia  
caused by drowning was returned.

Sympathy with the relatives of the de-  
ceased was expressed by the Coroner, and
