

Manager said that such a course adopted. It was the intention to build the houses and rebuild on the ground which there was some virgin soil. The number of houses to be built probably be more than sufficient, and the Alley could then be included. In reply to Mr Bourke, the Manager said that a little progress had been made in the erection of economic houses in the past few years, but it was expected that from six to eight hundred houses would be built in the near future.

Mr Stenson, Borough Surveyor, stated that the development of the Killalee site had been completed, and it only remained to get the plans and specifications to be referred from the Department to begin work on the scheme.

The Manager said that the Law Agent had under consideration a number of sites for acquisition.

It is decided to ask the Department to approve the plans and specifications of the scheme as soon as possible.

LEASEHOLDERS' GRIEVANCE.

Passed out of a resolution which had been passed from the Tralee Urban Council regarding the grievances of leaseholders, which called upon the Government to introduce legislation to remedy the condition.

City Manager said that he had got into the matter with regard to the houses in Limerick. From what he learned the leaseholders would have to pay ground rents for time immemorial in many cases. The money was going to the owners, who had no responsibility, and regard to the Corporation holdings no arrangement could be come to which by which the leaseholders could buy out at a future date.

Mr Keyes, T.D. said that the matter was very important from the point of view of everybody concerned. He understood that the Government were considering the matter with a view to introducing legislation under which the leaseholders could buy out their ground rents after a certain period.

The Mayor said that another aspect of the matter was that some of the owners had died without issue, and the money was going to the Government through the offices of the agents who had no claim to it at all. Mr Donnellan asked the Manager if it was the intention to provide facilities for the leaseholders to buy out their ground rents without any further delay.

Mrs Courtenay Croker.

We regret to announce the death of Mrs Croker, widow of Mr Courtenay Le Poer Trench Croker, D.L., which took place Thursday morning at her residence, Lansdowne Park, Limerick. Mrs Croker was a daughter of the late Archdeacon Hare, who, half a century ago, was Rector of St. Munchin's, Limerick. She took an active part in her day with her respected husband in works of charity and benevolence, and the organisation of various fetes in connection therewith. A lady of charming disposition, her passing some twelve months after Mr Croker's demise will be heard of with regret in the city and county.

BISHOP OF KILLALOE

And Italo-Abyssinia Crisis.

At Killaloe Synod, the Bishop, Dr. Patton, said he thought the world outlook was unspeakably sad. Mussolini was plainly resolved on war with Abyssinia at a time when the conscience of Christendom was shocked at such a prospect. Mussolini believed that by conquest he could invest Italy with immortal glory. The mind of all that is best in Christendom believed that he would cover himself and his country with immortal shame, even if he succeeded in quelling the people of Ethiopia by employing the horrors of modern scientific warfare against a comparatively defenceless people. How far climatic conditions, with their attendant difficulties of disease and death, might modify the glamour of his expected triumph none could tell, but glory can never emerge from such a campaign of slaughter, and the Christian world cannot afford to be indifferent, but must press on towards a peaceful solution, however remote it may seem.
