DEATH OF VERY REV. CANON FITZGERALD, P.P., V.F.

We regret to announce the death, which
took place at the Parochial House, Shana-
golden, this morning, of the Very Rev.
William Canon Fitzgerald, P.P., V.F., after
a rather short illness. He was born at
Rosbrien 84 years ago, and was ordained in
Rome in 1875. He was curate in Ballin-
garry and Bulgaden before being appointed
parish priest of Mungret, where he minis-
tered for twenty-two years. In 1921
Father Fitzgerald was translated to the
pastoral charge of Shanagolden and Foynes
and appointed a member of the Cathedral
Chapter and Vicar Forane. On the 20th
February last he celebrated the Diamond
Jubilee anniversary of his ordination to the
priesthood, when he was recipient of the
Apostolic Blessing. Canon Fitzgerald, who
was very highly respected and esteemed by
all classes and creeds, was brother of the
Rev. J. K. Fitzgerald, P.P., Kilcoleman.
