DEATH OF MR PETER D. FITZGERALD.

The death took place at his residence
Mondellihy, Adare, to day, of Mr Peter
David Fitzgerald in his 80th year, and after
an illness of some duration. The deceased
gentleman was a well known breeder of
bloodstock, and raced in England and this
country. For a number of years he suc-
cessfully managed Mrs W. W. Bailey's
stud at Rathbane until it was disposed of
a few years ago. At Mondellihy he
bred amongst others such well-known per-
formers as Hurstwood, Bellina, and North
Drift, and it was here that the White
Knight stood. Mr Fitzgerald took a great
interest in public affairs, and was a valued
member of Limerick County Council up to
the time of his resignation last year, when
he did not seek re-election. He is succeeded
on the Council by one of his sons, Mr Peter
J. Fitzgerald.
