Complaint was made at the meeting of the County Limerick Vocational Education Committee yesterday that the fees charged to students were excessive and deterred many from attending the courses promoted by the Committee in many parts of the county. That was the case particularly with the children of poor parents and should be remedied.

Mr J. McCormack did not think a fee of 10s exorbitant, having regard to the quality of the education given and the amount of money spent by the Committee in providing instruction.
