

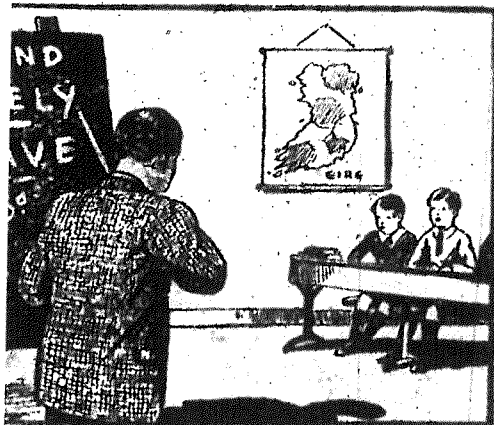

August 31st, 1934, has left personal estate  
in England and the Free State, valued at  
£7,412, 1s. 5d. Probate of her will, dated  
October 9th, 1927, with two codicils, has  
been granted to John McElligott, hardware  
assistant, of Thomas street, Rathkeale. She  
left £500 each to Annie O'Grady, Mary  
Anne McCarthy, and Julia McCarthy, £500,  
her residence and furniture, to her maid,  
Bridie Dooley, "who has given me faithful  
service for nearly twenty years," if still in her  
service; her business premises and stock to  
John McElligott "who manages my business  
and has always been true and faithful to me  
and my late brother," £500 to the Rev. Jas.  
Mary O'Grady "who is a priest in Australia"  
for such Masses and charities as he thinks  
fit, £500 to the Parish Priest of Rathkeale  
for the poor, £500 to St. John's Hospital,  
Limerick, £500 to the St. Vincent de Paul  
Society, Limerick, £500 to the Sisters of  
Good Shepherd Convent, Limerick, £200 to  
the Little Sisters of the Poor, Cork, £100 to  
the Sisters of Mercy, Rathkeale, for the  
Milk Fund for the poor of the Parish; and  
the residue of the property to her "con-  
fidential manager" John McElligott.
