INFANT SUDDEN DEATH.

A three month old infant, the child of Thomas Darcy, 10 Davis street, Lime-
rick, was found dead in bed on Monday morning. The body was removed to Barrington's Hospital for the purpose of a post mortem to have the cause of death ascertained.

Following the examination, Dr. S. McDonagh, house surgeon, Barrington's Hospital issued a certificate showing that there was no evidence of external injury on the body, and death in his opinion was caused by asphyxia, due to an enlarged thymus gland.

As a result, the Coroner did not consider an inquest necessary.


