

The Free State Civil Service Compensation Board has allowed 897 claims for compensation and retirement since it was set up under the Civil Service (Transferred Officers) Compensation Act, 1929.

In this total, according to information compiled by the Civil Service Federation, 304 claims to retirement have been allowed in consequence of change of Government, 120 owing to worsened conditions, and 470 following discharge.

Altogether 1,380 claims have been dealt with.
