Donegal town, the Annals were written, is keenly interested in the national ceremony of commemoration, and it is likely that the stamp issue will be made in conjunction with this solemnity. The Annals, which are a compilation Gaillonelle (8 to 1) of Irish history from the beginning of the world to the year 1608, were begun in 1631 by Michael O Cleirigh, Franciscan lay brother, member of a famous Donegal family of traditional historians, and three ather professional Ollambs. The four and a half years the work occupied were years of war and upheaval and persecution, and the compilers had to travel from end to end of the land in perpetual Forest Fire (9 to 2, fav) Amisfield (6 to 1) want and extreme personal danger. A suggestion has also been made that a more stately monument should be erected in Dublin in a public place, instead of hte present small memorial hidden away in oine of the smaller streets.
