Youth, said that they regarded settlement of the economic war as their first duty. They believed it could be settled on the following basis:—

First, Britain to waive any claim to further payments; second, a Committee of Inquiry to be set, up to decide whether or not the Free State was ever liable for payment of the monies in disute since the establishment of the Free State; if found not liable, the British to refund all payments made and monies collected since 1922.

Vocational organisation, he went on, had been their avowed object from the outset. Others hoisted it from their platform, but left it there, deserted like a fair-green Aunt Sally, to be attacked by every anti-national, anti-Christian, and Communist mud-slinger in the country.

Why was the Communist Party in Ireland not suppressed? They did not believe in freedom for Communism or in free speech for Communists.

CYCLED 90 MILES TO ATTEND COURT.

Before Mr W. J. Meagher, D.J., at Borrisokane Court, Edward Manning, Red Cow Lane, Dublin, was summoned for failing, as alleged, to produce a driver's licence.

Supt. O'Boyle said that the defendant had cycled from Dublin (a distance of over 90 miles) to attend the court.

The Superintendent asked the Justice to strike out the case under the circumstances, which his Worship consented to do.
