Limerick Man's Offer to be Accepted

In the High Court, Dublin, yesterday, before Mr Justice Meredith, in the suit in which the National Bank are the plaintiffs and Patrick Foley, Upper William street, Limerick, the defendant. Mr Geo. R. O'Connor (instructed by Mr P. C. Furlong), for the plaintiffs, applied for liberty to accept an offer of £385, which had been made for the premises, No. 7 Mallow street, Limerick. There was nearly £5,000 due to the bank, but although an order for sale of the premises mortgaged had been made, they had not been sold, and a Receiver had been appointed. The premises for which the offer had been made were only a small portion of those concerned, and the Receiver had reported that the offer was a good one and should be accepted. All the parties concerned had been notified, and there was no objection.

Mr Justice Meredith adjourned the motion for a fortnight, to enable the examiner to look into the title of the property.

AGED WOMAN'S SUDDEN DEATH.
