OIL STOVE TRAGEDY

Cabinet Maker Burned.

Inquest Result.

A burning accident, when an oil stove overturned on Saturday last, has resulted in the death of Patrick Cronin, cabinet maker, 31 Wickham Street, Limerick, at Barrington's Hospital this morning.

It appears that the deceased was cooking his breakfast in an oil stove when it overturned and enveloped him in flames. A man living in the room above that occupied by the deceased rushed down on hearing cries, and with the aid of clothing succeeded in extinguishing the flames. The unfortunate man was then removed to Barrington's Hospital suffering from severe burns on the arms and legs, and died at 1 a.m. this morning. He was 59 years and married, but had no family.

Mr J. S. McNeice, solicitor, Deputy Coroner, held an inquest at Barrington's Hospital this evening without a jury.

Medical evidence was given by Dr S. McDonogh, House Surgeon, Barrington's Hospital.

A verdict that death was due to shock, caused by burns accidentally sustained, was returned.
