

Oldest Priest in Limerick Diocese

Death of Dean Carty at Age of 96.

The death occurred on Saturday night of Right Rev M. Jasty, P.P., Dean of Limerick, at Dromore, Co. Limerick. Dean Carty, who was 96 years of age, was the oldest priest in the Diocese of Limerick.

Despite his great age he was active until some days ago. He celebrated Mass on Christmas Day.

The funeral took place after High Mass at Dromore to-day.

Dean Jasty was a member of a well-known County Limerick family, of farming stock, being son of the late Mr and Mrs William Jasty, Gormanstown, Kilmallock. He early displayed a calling for the priesthood, and, when still a young man proceeded to Dublin, where he completed his studies, and was ordained in 1855. He returned as a young curate to Ireland in the troublous period of the country's history, and served as curate at Kilmeasy, Knockmealdowns, Dromore and Kilshane, before being appointed P.P. of Ardpatrick, where he ministered with much success for thirty years. Father D. Quaid became seriously ill as Pastor of Dromore, and Father Carty was made Administrator and subsequently Parish Priest of Dromore and Ardpatrick. He was an zealous clergyman, and helped to build several schools in the parish.
