

The Late Mr Harry Mathews

Grand Old Figure Passed to E.s etward

The death of Mr Harry Mathews on the 25th December last, at his residence, West Watergate, marks the passing away of one of the remaining few of the Old Guard of Fenian advocates. His history is a notable one. He belonged to a highly respected family, who had carried on the banking trade in Cork city up to a few years ago, and up to some short years ago was a member of the clerical staff of Messrs James D'Arcy and Son. He was ever foremost in the ranks of Nationalism, and was one of those who helped to organize the U.A.A. in Limerick. He was a devoted friend of John Burke and Paddy O'Brien in the Amherst movement, when the freedom of John Dwyer, Charles J. Hayes and others was agitated for, and whom succeeded in its object in the end.

He was one of Fenians of the time a follower of Parnell, and fought actively for the return of Sir P. O'Brien to be M.P. for Limerick when defeated by Mr Francis Upton. He was good brother in every particular. He was succeeded in Menghlin College.
