## The Late Mr M McInerney

With very deep regret we announce the death of Mr Michael McInerney, who passed away at his residence, Davis street, Limerick, on Saturday last. The deceased, who had been in failing health for a considerable time back, was for years chief clerk in Messrs Sutton's coal office, and in his business capacity as well as in his private life he enjoyed the fullest confidence and respect of all who knew him.
