Died from Motor Accident

Coroner Dunne granted an adjournment at Kesh in the inquest on a labourer named O'Loughlin, who died from injuries inflicted by a motor lorry. The Coroner told the Inspector the jury's time should be considered in such cases.

Then a O'Donoghue, a passenger, said the lorry drove into a ditch, but it was impossible to avoid O'Loughlin, who crossed the road without warning.
