

Death of Infant

Twelve Months Sentence on Co. Limerick Woman

Before Mr HADDA and a jury, at the Central Criminal Court in Dublin on Thursday, Elizabeth Doody (41), a widow, of Garryduff, Newcastle West, Co. Limerick, was charged with the murder of her unnamed male infant child on the 19th February, 1936.

The accused pleaded not guilty of murder but guilty of manslaughter.

Mr P Lynch, K.C., who prosecuted, accepted the plea of guilty of manslaughter and entered a nolle prosequi on the charge of murder.

Mr Carroll O'Daly, who defended, said the accused woman had four children.

Mr Justice HADDA imposed a sentence of twelve months imprisonment with hard labour.
