Prisoner's Reply When Charged

Before Mr H L Coppor, B L at Kilmallock Court, Patrick Coll, an extensive farmer, and also father of four children, appeared in custody charged with the murder of James Maher.

The trag dy took place near the cottage of Maber's father in law, on the road between Bruff and Bruree, while Maker was cogaged in conversation with MI · Russell, of Ballysimon, Limsrick, who was also wounded.

The court proceedings lasted for only a few minutes while I spector Brazil gave evidence of atreeting and obviging accused. Some discussion was raised as to where the

bearing of the case would be taken.

Mr J J Power, State Solicitor, said the Guards had not yet completed their enquiries and therefore he would have to ask for a remand, baving first given evidence of arrest There would be a large number of witnesses to be examined-at least 40. The principal witness was in bospital under treatment, but he might be able to leave bospital within a week. He would suggest holding a special court at Bruff on Saturday 18th instant, at II o'clock.

Inspector Braz i, at present in charge of the Broff station, made a deposition in which he stated that he arrested socceed of 8.30 pm. on 4th July and charged bim with the wilful murder of James Maber. After being obarged the accused said : "Not wilfully, gir."

Accused was then remanded in custidy to Bruff Court on Saturday, 18th July.
