

partment's letter, and, therefore, to obtain the required amount you will have to increase the rate by 2d. next year.

Mr. Ryan said that other counties in the Free State were receiving grants on the same conditions, and he failed to see why Limerick could not borrow.

On the proposition of Mr. O'Donnell, seconded by Mr. Madden, it was unanimously decided to accept the grant subject to being allowed to borrow, and it was also decided to urge on the Minister the desirability of continuing the three years' scheme of road works.

A resolution from the Dublin County Council calling for the abolition of the Appointments Commissioners was marked "read."

The Council adopted a resolution from the Limerick City Council calling on the Executive Council to introduce legislation to entitle recipients of small pensions from Trades Unions to receive the full Old Age Pension of 10s. a week without any deduction by reason of being in receipt of superannuation or pension.

On the proposition of Mr. Madden, a resolution was unanimously adopted calling on the Government to restore the "cuts" made in the Guards' allowance to the same as it was prior to 1924.
