The international agreement does not, therefore, contain any stipulation as to a time limit or other condition incidental to the construction of the airport, which is being undertaken and financed solely by the Saorstát Government. It will be appreciated, nevertheless, that the development of the trans-Atlantic Air Transport Services by way of the Saorstát depends upon the provision of a suitable airport in this country."
