

SHANNON MYSTERY

Fruitless Identification Efforts.

Inquest on Drowned Man

The unidentified body of a middleaged man was recovered from the Shannon at Limerick on Sunday morning. Deceased appeared to have been in the water only a short time. He was eleched only in shirt and trousers, which gives rike to the theory that he may have fallen overboard from a ship which left the city late on Saturday night. body was removed to the City Morgue pending an inquest.

Mr. J. S. McNeice, solicitor, Deputy Coroner, held an inquest at Barrington's Hospital on Tuesday touching the death

of the deceased man.

Sergeant J. Curtin O'Curry Station, conducted the enquiry.

Guard Maxwell O'Curry Street, stated that on the morning of the 15th inst. he received a report that the body of a man was lying on the foreshore of the river at Corkanree. He proceeded to the place and discovered the body lying face downwards some stones. He exon amined the body which was clad only in shirt and trousers He searched the clothing, which revealed nothing. The only mark was a bruise on the little toe of the right foot. Clasped in the dead man's left hand he found a Rosary beads.

ENQUIRIES MADE.

Sergeant Curtin-Have you male enquiries from all the Shipping Companies with a view to establishing his identity? -Yes, I have made all possible enquiries, and no man answering to his description has been reported as missing.

The Guard added that he also made a search of a wide area near where the body was found, but could find no trace

of other clothing.

Coroner-It is amazing that all efforts to identify this man have failed.

NO MARKS OF VIOLENCE.

Dr. D. O'Sullivan, acting R.M.S., Barrington's Hospital, stated he examined the body of the deceased. There were no marks of viblence. Death, in his opinion. Was due to asphyxia following drowning.

Coroner-Did you carry out a postmortem examination?

Dr. O'Sullivan-No.

Coroner-Would you prefer to satisfy yourself as to the cause of death before exr essing a final opinion?

· · · O Sallivan--Yes, I think it would be safer if I did, as there is no evidence to show how he came into the water.

The doctor added that there was a red and white religious cord around the man's waist.

Coroner-He looks a fine respectable man, and it is extraordinary that nobody has reported him as missing. He does not look the type of man who could be missing without enquiries being made.

The Coroner then adjourned the inquest to permit the doctor to make a post-mortem examination.

DESCRIPTION OF DECEASED.

The descripion of the man is as follows:-45 to 50 years, 6 feet, bluish eyes, very fair hair, full moustache but cut short full round face large nose, 14 stone weight, wearing dark blue trousers, pale blue shirt with black stripes.
