

## LICENSING LAWS.

### Co. Limerick Publican Fined for Breach.

Joseph Healy, publican, the Square, Rathkeale, was charged before Mr. C. Kenny B.L., at Rathkeale District Court with a breach of the licensing laws.

Supt. Cooney, Adare, prosecuted, and Mr. M. F. Noonan, solr., Adare, defended.

Sergeant Keegan, Rathkeale, deposed that on Sunday night, 25th April last, while on plain clothes duty with Guard O'Brien, he entered the licensed premises of the defendant at 10.40 p.m. He found eight men drinking on the premises.

Mr. Noonan, on behalf of the defendant, pleaded guilty, and said the men pressed on the defendant to admit them for a drink.

The Justice fined the publican £1, without endorsement, and the men found on the premises were fined 2/6 each.
