Article 12, which deals with the office of President, says he shall be elected by direct vote of the people, and shall hold office for seven years.

The President shall, on the nomination of the Dail, appoint a Prime Minister, or Head of the Government, who will be called An Taoiseach.

The Senate will be composed of 60 members, of whom 11 shall be nominated by the Prime Minister, and the remain- der elected as follows—Three by the National University, three by Trinity College, and forty-three by the Dail.

Bringing Family to Limerick

Sergeant Jeremiah Griffin, G.S., who was recently transferred from Burton- port to Limerick, was fatally injured, when the car which he was driving in was in collision with another car on the Donegal-Mouncharles road last evening.

Sergeant Griffin died a few minutes after admission to Donegal District Hos- pital.

He was travelling to Burtonport for the purpose of taking his wife and family to Limerick.

Sergeant Griffin rendered great assist- ance in the recovery of the bodies fol- lowng the Aranmore disaster, being in charge of the Gardai, who for many days helped in the search.

Sergeant Griffin was a native of Kerry, and was aged about 40. He was ap- pointed to Limerick about a month ago.
