FATAL INJURIES.

Co. Limerick Cyclist's Fall.

The Inquest.

Mr. Michael McCarthy (45), farmer, un-
married, of Cross Pallasgreen, Co. Lime-
rick, died at the County Hospital, Croom,
on Sunday evening, as the result of in-
juries received when on Saturday night
at about 9 o'clock, he was cycling from
Newpallas village to his home, and when
cycling down hill he applied the brakes
too suddenly, and was pitched forward on
the concrete road.

He was found shortly afterwards in a
pool of blood, his bicycle a short distance
away. Bleeding profusely from the head
and ears, he was taken in an unconscious
condition to the house of Mr. J. McGrath,
Tullabeg, a few yards away.

Spiritual and medical aid were sum-
moned immediately, and Dr E. J. McEnery,
Doon, attended to the injured man, and
had him removed by ambulance to the
County Hospital, Croom, where he died
on Sunday evening without regaining con-
sciousness. Deceased was one of the most
popular figures in the locality, and his sad
demise has shocked the district, where the
news of his death was received with much
regret. He was uncle of Rev. T. McCarthy
C.C.

THE INQUEST.

The verdict at the inquest into the cir-
cumstances touching his death yesterday
was that he died from laceration of the
brain, following a fracture of the base of
the skull, resulting from an accidental fall
while cycling.

The Coroner at the inquest, which was
held in Croom, was Dr. Cleary, Hospital.
The Gardai were represented by Superin-
tendent Holland, Pallasgreen.
