whether flying boats or landplanes will  
be used. Both types of aircraft have  
their supporters, and the "struggle be-  
hind the scenes" is likely to be keen,  
but if information is correct, landplanes  
will win the day. Flying boats are slower  
and, compared with landplanes, cannot  
carry, power for power, the same payload,  
an important factor so far as commercial  
flying is concerned. In the past it has  
been argued that flying boats would be  
more suitable, because in the event of a  
forced landing they would be able to re-  
main afloat. Most experts now agree  
that the longest period they could remain  
afloat in fairly rough seas is about one  
hour, and this advantage is outweighed by  
loss in speed and load. Another factor  
which would operate against flying boats  
is the presence for several months of the  
year of large masses of ice in the vicinity  
of Newfoundland and on those stretches  
of water suitable for seaplane harbour-  
ings.
