

LIMERICK FARMER KILLED

Fatal Car Skid Near Rathkeale

James Quaid, farmer, Croagh, Rathkeale, was fatally injured, and his companion, Wm. Madden, of Croagh, was seriously injured in a road accident at Croagh last evening.

As far as can be ascertained, both men were motoring on the main Rathkeale—Limerick road, going in the direction of Croagh. Their car skidded on the road, and crashed into a fence. Both men were pitched on to the road, where they were found some minutes later by a passing motorist.

Quaid sustained a broken neck, and died some time later in Croom County Hospital.
