

Wound In Throat

Tragic Death of Aged County Limerick Man

A verdict that death was due to shock and hæmorrhage from a wound across the throat self-inflicted, whilst the deceased was temporarily insane, was returned by Dr Cleary, Coroner for the Newcastle West district, at an inquest upon Richard Hanly, aged 60, Barnagh, Newcastle West. The Coroner sat without a jury.

Evidence was given that the deceased was found on the roadway near his home by a neighbour named Daniel Dunworth on Sunday evening. The deceased was bleeding profusely from a cut across the neck, and died shortly after admission to the Croon Hospital.

The Gardai were represented at the inquest by Superintendent Kelly, Newcastle West.

The deceased leaves a wife and four children between the ages of three and sixteen years. He was a large farmer.
