

Young Limerick Soldier Killed.

Victim of Motor Cycling Crash

Private Thomas Murphy (20), National Army, Athlone, was killed, and Private P. Broder seriously injured, when a motor cycle on which they were riding crashed into a wall near Gallows Hill, Athlone, on Sunday evening.

Private Murphy, a native of Limerick city, was attached to the training staff of the Tirconnaill Regiment, Volantiers Corps. Private Broder, who is a native of Wexford, was garrisoned there. He was rushed to Hospital.

The men were proceeding in Athlone from the Roumannon direction, and the tragedy occurred as a corner wall of the railway station.

They were attended by Dr. P. L. O'Connell, M.C., St. Peter's, Athlone.
