

Doctor's Sudden Death

While sitting in his car, near the North Strand on Saturday Dr Patrick Holmes Killaloe, Dispensary Medical Officer of the Annacarriga district, had a sudden heart seizure and died in a short time. He was rushed to Barrington's Hospital, where life was found to be extinct. At the time of the occurrence Dr Holmes was accompanied by a member of his family, who secured spiritual aid. The late Dr Holmes was about 50 years of age, and was a medical practitioner for about 25 years. He was son of the late Mr Robert Holmes, Athlunkard, Limerick, a well-known farmer and landowner, and was brother of the late Dr Holmes of Seariff, and of the late Mr Wm. Holmes, C.E. He leaves a widow and family to mourn his loss.

The funeral took place on Monday to the family burial place at Parteen after Requiem Mass at St. Mary's Church.

Burned to Death

County Limerick Farmer's Sad End

P Hascott (65), single, a small farmer living alone, was found dead in the kitchen of his home at Newbridge, Kilkenny, by his brother on Friday morning. It would appear that his clothes got ignited by the kitchen fire, and that he struggled to the centre of the floor and fell near a bundle of faggots which lay there. When found, one of his legs was almost completely burned off. Parts of his clothing, and some of the faggots were also burned.

At an inquest held by the Coroner, Dr Hennigan, a verdict was recorded of death from burns accidentally received.
