P Hassett (68), single, a small farmer living alone, was found dead in the kitchen of his bom; at Newbridge, his hkeale, by his brother on Friday morning. It would sppear that his clothes got ignited by the isoben fire, and that he struggled to the centre of the fi-or and fell near a bundle of laggets which lay there. When found, one of his lags was althost completely burned off. Perts of his clothing, and some of the
