Death of Mr. P. Corran

With much regret we record the death of Mr Patrick Curran, which took place at his residence, Co. View Terrace, Ballinacurra, at the age of 58 years. The decessed was a member of the General Post Office telegraph staff for over thirty years, and in this connection it can be sated that he was one of the most competent and efficient operators to be found in the service. He served in that capacity in the South African War. and again the Great War, and was prerent at the retreat of the Germans back to the Somme.
