

Late Mr. M. P. Moloney, Abbeyfeale.

The death has taken place of Mr. Michael P. Moloney, victualler and cattle dealer, of Church street, Abbeyfeale, after a long illness.

He had been connected with the trading interests of the town for more than half a century and took an active part in establishing the local fairs many years ago.

During the Anglo Irish war he and the members of his family were subjected to many hardships.

A very large procession accompanied the remains to St. Mary's Parish Church, and the attendance at the interment in the parish cemetery was also large.

Many expressions of sympathy were tendered the relatives and a large number of Mass cards included one from the local Fianna Fail Cumann, and the 2nd. Batt., West Limerick Brigade, Old I.R.A.
