Co. Limerick Man Charged

UNUSUAL GASE

At Adare District Court, before Mr CB Kenny, n.J., Wm. Madden fairner, Rahcon, Crosgh, was charged with the manual-aughter of James Quard (35) farmer, of the name address, at Baltycannon, Crosgh, on 15th October, when the two men were returning from Rathkesie in a two restir car driven by the accused.

Surgeon J F O'Connor, Cro on Hospital, stated deceased was conscious but suffering from severe shock and was unable to give any account of his injuries. There was also a facerated would on the right sale of the head, and the arms, body and left eye were paralysed, due to a broken neck. Deceased

died about 4 a.m. the following day.

Accused was admitted to the hospital with deceased. Madden was saffering from rather severe bruises on the lower part of his neek and shoulder and from muscle strain. He was conscious but somewhat dezed, and could give no account of the accident. He was detained in the hospital

for more than a month.

David Barry, architect's assistant. Limerick, said he was motoring towards Newcastle West. At the bend at the far side of Croagh he met a two scater car coming towards him at its wrong sideand at a fast pace. Witness pulled into the left hand sade, and when the driver of the oncoming car as whim he swerved violently to his left side and skidded slightly in doing so. The car continued to wobble, but appeared to straighten up just as it passed witness.

Francis Kearney, Limerick, passenger in previous witness's car, corroborated, and said in his opinion the oncoming car was driven in a fairly reckless manner around

the bend.

The Justice adjourned the further hearing to the next Kathkeale Court.
