LEASEHOLDERS' CONVENTION

Address by National Director

Proposed New Bill,

Mr. P. Bourke, B.C., Chairman, presided at a largely attended convention of the United Leaseholders' Organisation, held at the Town Hall, Limerick, this afternoon.

Mr. Owen Mulholland, National Director in the course of an address, said that the programme of the Organisation was—(a) Legislation to fix fair ground and lease rents on all private houses and business premises; (b) Legislation introducing a National Urban Freehold Purchase Scheme to enable all leaseholders to buy out their ground rents or lease rents at a fair price, either for cash or over a period of years on the annuity system, and so make every home and business premises a freehold just as farms are to-day under the Land Purchase Acts.

Explaining the new Leaseholders' Bill he said—The Bill is an effort to remove from the Landlord and Tenant 1931 Act the unreasonable clauses that are in the landlords' interest. It is not, however, to be regarded as the solution of the ground rent question. It is the first slice of the legislation for the leaseholders. It contains a provision that any landlord or superior landlord who desires to sell any ground rent or superior rent in a holding shall be bound
