Funeral Tribute.

With very deep regret we announce
the death of Mr. Wm. Plant, "Suncroft,"
Westfields, N.C.R., which took place
quite unexpectedly at Barrington's Hos-
pital after a short illness on Tuesday
last, 1st March.

The deceased, who was 38 years of age,
was representative of J. Matterson and

He was a member of the Committee of
the Limerick and District Kennel Club
