OBITUARY

MR. THOMAS J. LOONEY.

We regret to announce the death of Mr. Thomas J Looney, which took place at his residence, Fort Prospect, Limerick, last night. The deceased had not been in the best of health for some time and the end was not unexpected. Mr. Looney, who was a native of East Limerick, had been associated with the commercial life of the city for a long number of years, and purchased the provision business of Looney and Co., Upper Gerald Griffin Street. Enterprise and initiative under his keen intellect were crowned with success attained by the firm, which came to be one of the largest purveyors of bacon, hams, and butter in the country. The firm also controlled the business of Lynch and Spain, Roche's Street, and when Mr Looney retired some years ago his nephews, Messrs. J. J. and T. J. Corboy, took over the management. In private life the deceased was unassuming, a good friend, and very charitably disposed. In their sorrow the public sympathy will be given to his brother, Mr. John Looney, Inch St. Laurence, his nephews, and other members of his family.

The funeral takes place at 12 o'clock to-morrow from St. John's Cathedral, after Requiem Mass, for Mount St. Laurence Cemetery. —
