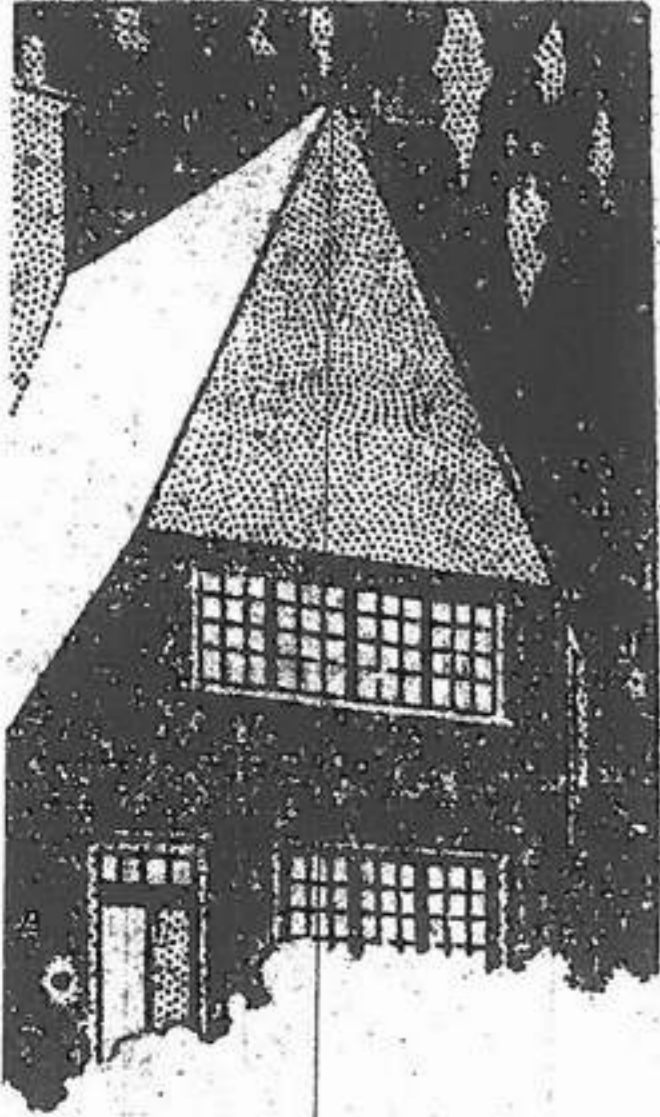

## CITY INQUEST.

### Sequel to Accident.

#### Elderly Woman's Death.

An elderly woman, Miss N. Armstrong, 13 Rutland Street, Limerick, who was taken to Barrington's Hospital following an accident in Rutland Street on the 28th July, when she was knocked down by a motor car and injured, died on Saturday.

Mr. J. S. McNeice, solicitor, Deputy Coroner, held an inquest at Barrington's Hospital Tues. afternoon, touching the death of the deceased.

Inspector Brassil G.S., conducted the enquiry, and Mr P G. Collins, solicitor, represented the driver of the car, T. Earlie, junior, Garryowen.

Miss Eileen Cross, Rutland Street, gave evidence of identification. She lived with the deceased for a number of years. Deceased was about 50 years of age and carried on a shop in Mungret Street. She was not aware that the deceased suffered from chronic bronchitis and asthma.

Dr. S. McDonagh, Barrington's Hospital, stated that he examined the deceased on her admission to hospital, when she was suffering from fracture of the leg and arm. She was suffering from chronic bronchitis and asthma. Death, in his opinion, was due to chronic bronchitis and asthma.

Inspector—Would the injuries she sustained in the accident have accelerated death?

Doctor—No. The actual injuries themselves did not cause her death, but the shock may have had a bad effect on her chest condition.

Inspector—Well Mr. Coroner, as there is a doubt, and it is in everybody's interest, I will ask that you adjourn the inquest. I would prefer that the papers in the case would go to the Attorney-General.

Coroner—Very well. I think it is in everybody's interests that that should be done.

In reply to Mr. Collins, Dr. McDonagh said that if the deceased had not been suffering from bronchial trouble she would probably not have died.

Inspector Brassill said that in view of the doctor's evidence he would much prefer that the inquest be adjourned.

Mr. Collins—I do not think there is any doubt about the cause of death.

The inquest was adjourned indefinitely
