SPANISH PRINCE DEAD

Victim of Dread Desease

For thirty-one years haunted by the fear of bleeding to death, the Count of Covadonga, eldest son of ex-King Alfonso of Spain, died on Tuesday at Miami, Florida, in the manner he dreaded. Heamophilia, from which he had suffered all his life, complicated the injuries he received in a car smash early on Tuesday, and it was not until just before his death that the flow of blood was ..arrested.

The Count had had many close calls, and his life had been repeatedly despaired of when the bleeding attacks came on. It was a tooth extraction in infancy that revealed that he was subject to the dread disease.

By a tragic coincidence, his younger brother, Don Jaime, met his death in a similar way. He died of internal bleeding, resulting from a car accident in Austria in 1934.
