## CHILD'S DEATH

### Fell Into Boiling Water

#### Sad Occurrence

A verdict that death was due to shock, following collapse, was returned by Mr. J. S. McNeice, solicitor, Deputy Coroner, at an inquest in Barrington's Hospital, Limerick, on Wednesday, on Frederick Fails (3½), who died on Tuesday, following scalds sustained at his home, 84 Lansdowne Park, Limerick.

Sergt. O'Mahony, Mary Street Station, conducted the inquiry.

Evidence of identification was given by Mr F Fails, father of the deceased, who said he was a commercial traveller, and was away from home on Monday afternoon when the boy was scalded.

#### DOCTOR'S EVIDENCE.

Dr. S. McDonagh, house surgeon, Barrington's Hospital, stated that the deceased was admitted to the hospital on Monday afternoon, suffering from extensive scalds. He died at 1 a.m. on Tuesday from shock; following collapse.

#### FELL INTO BOILING WATER.

Margaret Quin, a maid, stated that on Monday afternoon she was washing clothes in the yard. Mrs. Fails and the deceased were present. There was a bucket of boiling water there, which she was pouring into a basin. She was holding the deceased by the hand, when he suddenly turned and overbalanced into the boiling water. The witness added that Mrs. Fails brought the little boy into the house, and after bathing the scalds with olive oil, sent for medical assistance. The child was then removed to hospital.

The Coroner returned a verdict in accordance with the medical testimony, and expressed deep sympathy with the bereaved parents.
