The Acting City Manager, Mr. M. F. Donnellan, to-day received a communication from the Local Appointments Commission recommending Mr. Robert Herbert, 41 Upper Mount Street, Dublin, for the position of Limerick City Librarian, rendered vacant by the resignation of Mr. J. P. McNamara.

Mr. Herbert was formerly employed as Assistant Public Librarian with the Pembroke Public Library, Dublin, and has held appointments in Dun similar Laoghaire, and Thomas Street Public Library, Dublin.

The salary attaching to the position is £200 per annum, with house, light, and fuel.

When the appointment is ratified by the Borough Council, Mr. Herbert will enter upon his new duties.
