

Dublin Man's Appointment

Experienced Official

The Acting City Manager, Mr. M. F. Donnellan, to-day received a communication from the Local Appointments Commission recommending Mr. Robert Herbert, 41 Upper Mount Street, Dublin, for the position of Limerick City Librarian, rendered vacant by the resignation of Mr. J. P. McNamara.

Mr. Herbert was formerly employed as Assistant Public Librarian with the Pembroke Public Library, Dublin, and has held similar appointments in Dun Laoghaire, and Thomas Street Public Library, Dublin.

The salary attaching to the position is £200 per annum, with house, light, and fuel.

When the appointment is ratified by the Borough Council, Mr. Herbert will enter upon his new duties.

His Lordship Most Rev. Dr. Keane presided at St. John's Cathedral on Sunday, the Feast of the Kingship of Christ.

On entering the Cathedral his Lordship inspected a guard of honour of St. John's Troop of Boy Scouts, who were present with their colours. The Mayor (Ald. D. Bourke, T.D.), accompanied by the mace bearers, and the Corporation, attended in state. They walked in procession through the Cathedral grounds, preceded by the City Fire Brigade in full uniform.

The City Coroner (Mr. J. S. McNeice) was also present.

Rev. Father Lee, St. Munchin's College, and Rev. Father Martin, do., were deacons at the throne.

The celebrant of the Mass was Rev. Father Gill, C.C., St. John's; deacon, Rev. Father O'Grady, C.C., do.; sub-deacon, Rev. Father Creed, C.C., do.; master of ceremonies, Rev. J. Brassill, C.C., do.

Rev. Father O'Grady preached on the Kingship of Christ.

The Palestrina Choir was conducted by Prof. King Griffin; and Master Jim Burke, leading soloist at the Cathedral, sang beautifully the "Panis Angelicus," by Cesar Frank; while Fauras famous duet, to the words of "O Salutaris," was rendered by Messrs. Brazier and Barry.

Subsequently the Bishop received the Mayor and Corporation in the Sacristy.
