## PERSECUTION OF JEWS

### Request to An Taoiseach

At a meeting of the County Council to-day.

Mr. Hartney proposed a resolution, requesting Mr. de Valera, in his capacity as Minister for External Affairs, to use his influence to bring to an end the persecution of the Jews and Catholics, and other Christians in Germany. The barbarities perpetrated by the Nazi regime against an innocent and unoffending people had shocked the civilised world. Jews should be allowed to live in any country of their adoption without being treated in a savage manner.

Senator D. J. Madden seconding, said that what the Nazis had done to Cardinals Innitzer and Faulhaber indicated their despotism.

The resolution was passed unanimously.

## "PARTITION MUST END"

A novel resolution was adopted at a meeting of Limerick County Council to-day.

On the proposition of Mr. E. Walsh, a resolution was passed asking the Government to have all letters stamped with the slogan, "Partition must end."
