Death of Mr. P J McQuaid

Well-Known Patriot and Athlete

The death occurred at Clarecastle, on
Wednesday night, of Mr. Philip J McQuaid,
Sheriff of County Clare. He was born in
Newry and admitted a solicitor in 1913,
after which he was associated with Mr. W
H Cox, M.P., in the administration of the
first Dail Eireann Courts. Owing to his
political activities, he was compelled to
leave his native county, and was appointed
Sheriff of County Clare in 1922, by the
first Free State Government. A noted ath-
lete in his young days, he took the keenest
interest in all forms of sport, and excelled
at field events, particularly the high jump.
He formed the first branch of the Irish
Anglers' Association in Ennis and was its
first President. He had the honour of
being the first and last Sheriff of Clare
under a native Government, as under the
Courts of Justice Act the duties will in
future be discharged through the Office of
the Circuit Court Registrar.

At a meeting of the Ennis Angling Ass-
ociation, deepest sympathy was tendered to
the bereaved family on the motion of Mr. P
J McNamara, M.A., Chairman, seconded by
Mr. D Honan, Secretary.

The Clare Board of Health also sym-
pathised with the family.
